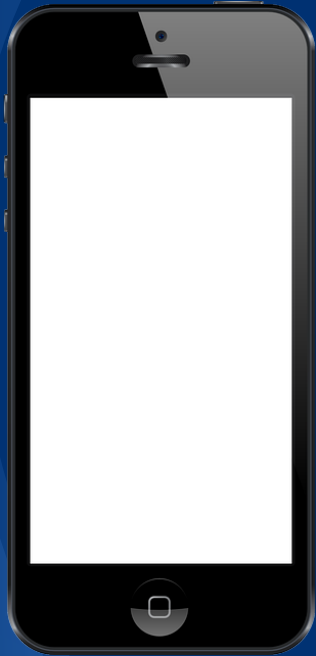


CELL PHONE POLICY

HALLWAYS DURING PASSING TIME

RESPONSIBILITIES & ETIQUETTE:

- Don't clog the hallways
 - Get to your destination first or at your locker
- Don't text while walking -- you could run into someone.



CAFETERIA

- You may use your phones during lunch in the cafeteria



PROHIBITED AREAS



- Classroom (unless approved by teacher)
- Library
- During assemblies or meetings
- Restrooms
- Locker Rooms



PROHIBITED BEHAVIOR

- The use of camera and video phones is absolutely forbidden at ANY TIME
This includes during lunch or in the hallways
- Taking video or pictures violates other's rights



PROHIBITED BEHAVIOR

- You may not create, send, share, view, receive, or possess an indecent visual depiction of oneself or another person through the use of a computer, electronic communication device or cell phone.
- Cyber Bullying will not be tolerated and will be handled per our discipline policy.

PROHIBITED BEHAVIOR

MUSIC:

- Do not use headphones while walking the halls. You may use headphones in the cafeteria during lunch.
- Do not play music for others to hear.



SO YOU KNOW.....(new policy)

School authorities may require a student or his/her parents to provide a password or other related account information in order to gain access to the student's account or profile on a social networking website if the school authorities have reasonable cause to believe that a student's account on a social networking website contains evidence that a student has violated a school disciplinary rule or procedure.

OTHER REMINDERS

- Students must turn off and put away cell phone when requested by a staff member.
- Phones must be given to staff member when requested.
- Don't forget to turn phone off when entering your class

- Be responsible with your cell phone privileges.
